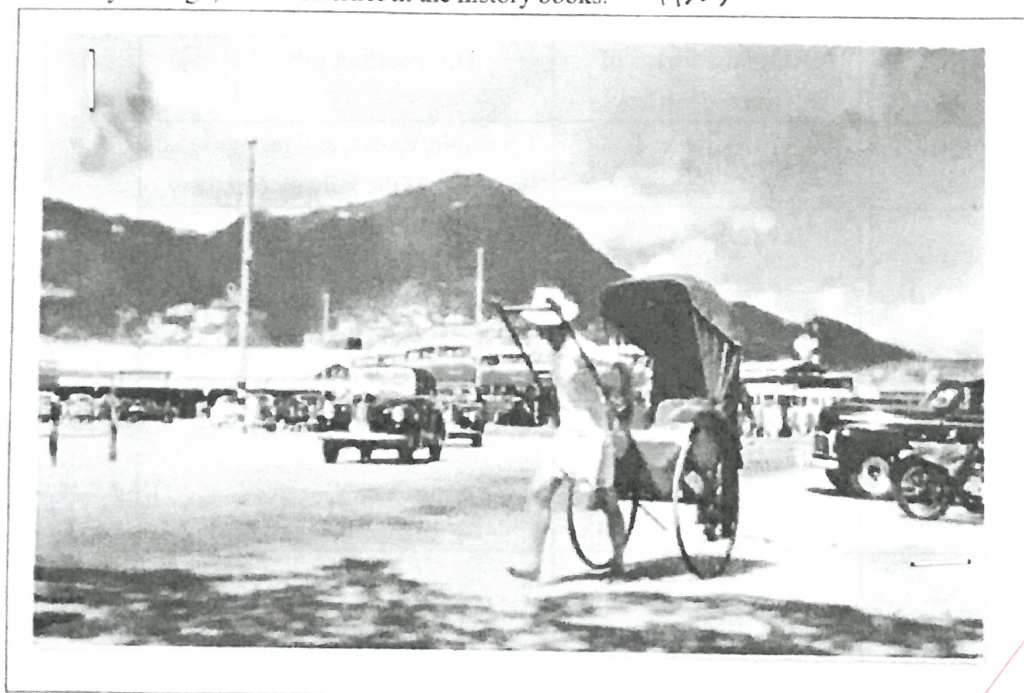
2. Take a selfie in a street historical building that tell us about the history of Hong Kong.
